The author has a humorous writing style and seems to have at his command an interesting vignette about almost any subject related to Book Collecting. Don't be misled by the publication date of 1966, this book first appeared in 1927, and was revised in 1935 and 1946 prior to this edition. So you are basically reading a book on book collecting from the mid-twenties, with a few more recent authors and titles scattered about. One recurring example are the books of Stephen Crane, with his books from the 1890's and 1900's. There are lot of rare Poe books mentioned as well. The only more modern author I noticed was Hemingway. So that's the drawback, this is quite an old book, written in the style of that era.
