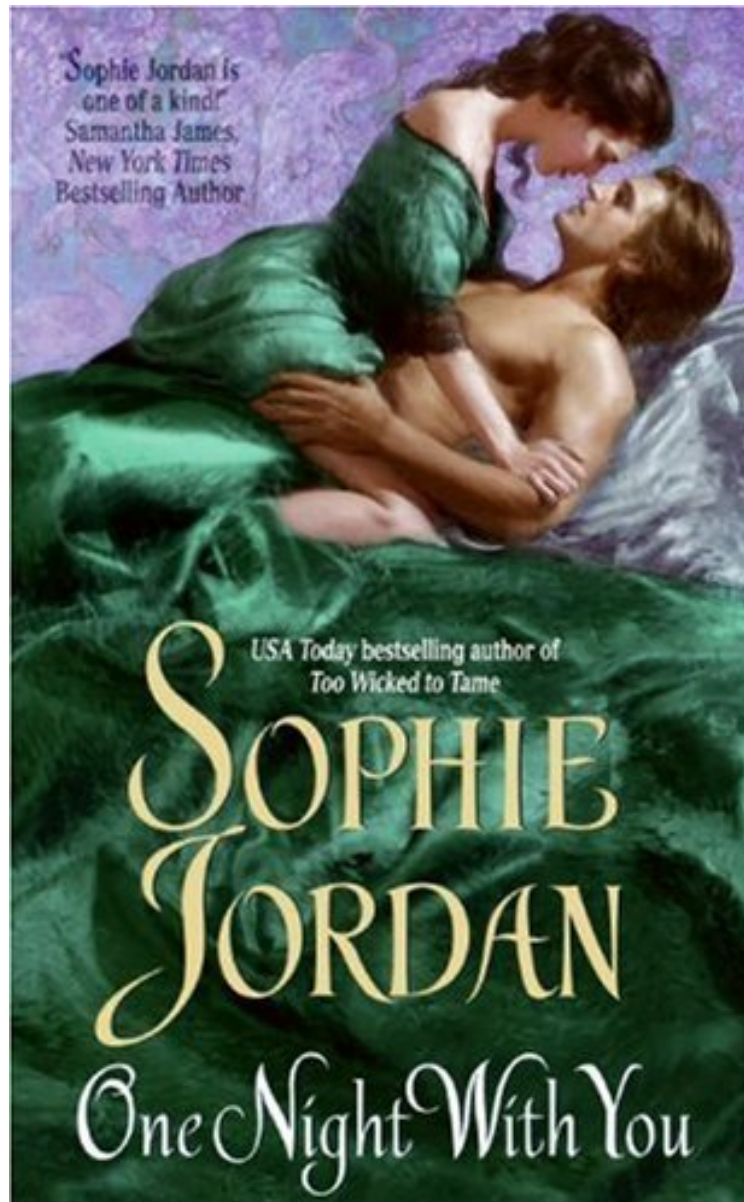

It's irritating when the long-awaited love confession is on one of the last few pages. The one thing that bothered me the most, because I'm a huge grammar/spelling dork, was the bad editing. There were many, many, many errors. Example: "Her frowned, saying nothing." All you need to do is drop the "r" from what obviously was supposed to be "He." And there are other things like that all over.
