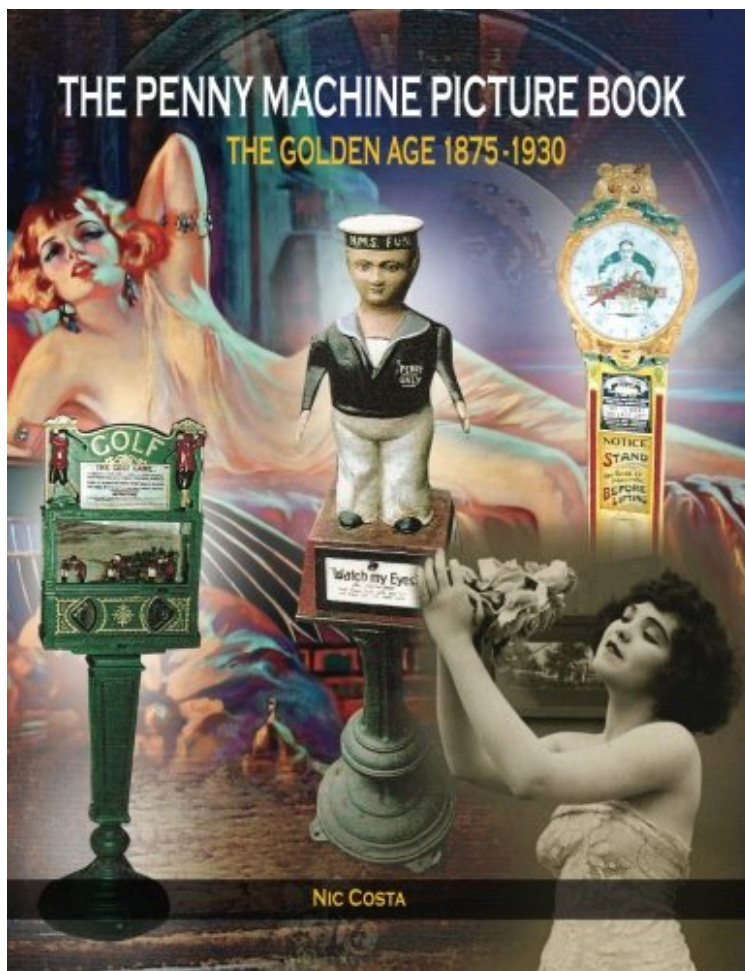

For example many of today's important industries were introduced to the public by means of these devices.Automatic machines were first introduced on a mass scale during the last two decades of the nineteenth century, initially in England and within a short space of time to Western Europe and North America.The pictorial emphasis of this current work is upon the very early period considered by many to be the golden age of the penny machine!
