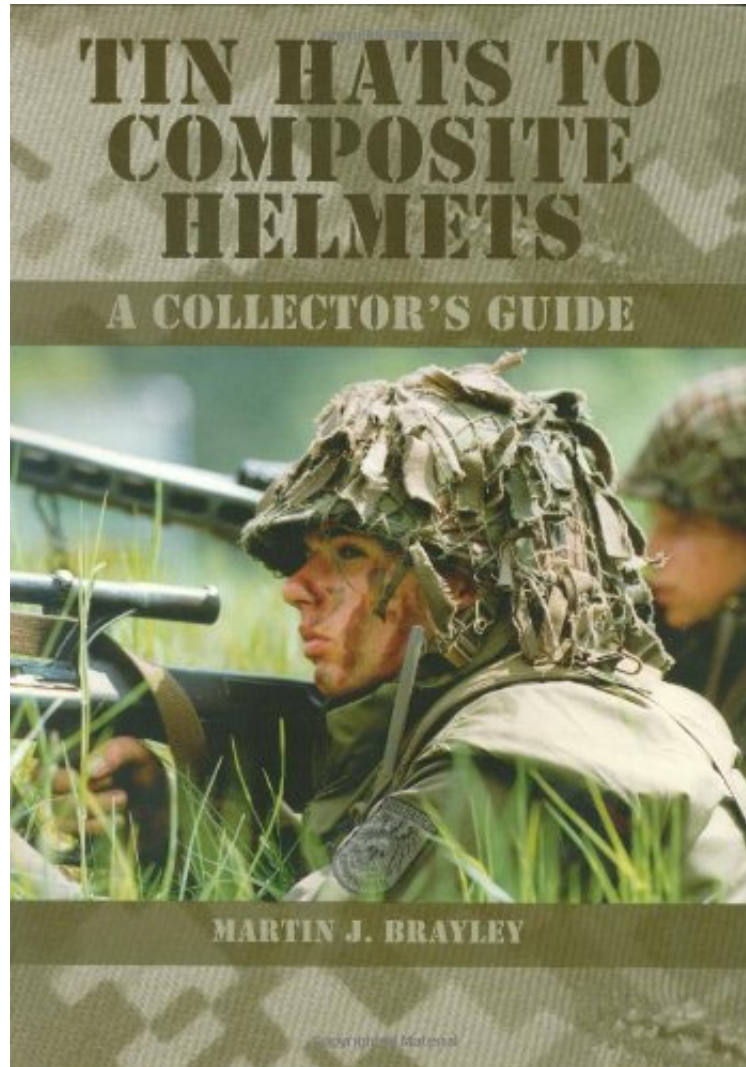

In addition to the regular combat steel helmets found in most books on the subject, the author has sections on civil defense and limited production pieces. There is not great depth to any country or type, but it is a survey book and not intended to be comprehensive. Two things that annoyed me were the author's insistence that the US 1st Cav division is actually the 2nd Cav Div. and the omission of the

Japanese WWII tankers' helmet, which is not too hard to locate to be photographed. With around 700 images of a vast range of helmets, this is an essential work for collectors and historians alike.
